12:00-12:45 – African Hand Drum Circle with Paul Dumas

Following the workshop, we will jointly lead a massive second line to honor the memories and celebrate the lives of beloved Salem icons Bob and Allen Berzofsky, founders of Dodge Street Bar & Grill, in front of the main stage and in a loop around the Festival grounds.

12:00-12:45 – The World of Jazz Guitar with Steve Lacey

TRANSPORTATION

Salem Trolley offers an inexpensive shuttle to the festival with stops at the National Parks Visitor's Center, Blaney Street Wharf and Shetland Park at 45 Congress St., where there is adjacent parking. The trolley is free to Salem residents; just stop by the office on Central Street for a pass and bring your I.D.

The *Boston Harbor Cruises Ferry* stops at National Parks Visitors Center and Shetland Park, connecting with the Salem Trolley festival shuttle.
